V. Opposing Viewpoint: (This component is required to “meet the standard.” Its purpose is to let the reader know you have considered another point of view and have a rebuttal to it.)

- A. Opposing point to your argument. (Be sure to select a valid point you can successfully rebut).
- B. Your rebuttal to the opposing point.
- C. Elaboration to back your rebuttal.

VI. Conclusion:

- A. Summary of main points or reasons
- B. Restate Focus statement.
- C. Personal comment or a call to action.
